41. Incident Safety Officer (F0729)



This 2-day course examines the Safety Officer's role at emergency responses. This course focuses on operations within an Incident Command System (ICS) as a Safety Officer and emphasizes response to all-hazards types of situations.

Instructor

Stephen McLane currently serves as the Executive Director of the Missouri Emergency Response Commission. In this role, he leads a team of dedicated staff to ensure that the response community is prepared for hazardous materials emergencies. He previously served as an Environmental Program Specialist with the Missouri Department of Natural Resources. Stephen was a member of the Environmental Emergency Response section and responded to hazardous materials releases and other environmental disasters. For ten years prior to moving to emergency response, he was the Department of Natural Resources Health and Safety Consultant. Stephen has also served with the Boone County Fire Protection District since 1990. He currently holds the rank of Captain/Emergency Medical Technician. He is an Adjunct Faculty member with the University of Missouri Fire Rescue Training Institute and a contract instructor for the National Fire Academy. His instructional background primarily focuses on responder safety and hazardous materials response. McLane completed an Associate of Science degree in Fire Service Administration from Columbia College in 2008, and in 2012 he completed the Company Officer Certificate program from the University of Missouri Fire Rescue Training Institute. He holds a Fire Instructor II certification with the Missouri Division of Fire Safety as well as an Emergency Medical Technician license.
