OBJECTIVES:

Promote Home and Fire Safety education to people of all ages.

CAPABILITIES:

The Safety House #3 was built by Surrey Fire Safety in Ohio. It was funded by a FEMA AFG Fire Prevention grant and came to Area 3 in October 2008. This trailer has unique features that allow you to teach fire safety (as a child safety house). The fire safety package begins in the kitchen where you learn about typical emergencies that occur in the kitchen. Props used to teach this message include the flaming pot and the flaming trash can. There is a set of bleachers in the kitchen where participants may sit and listen to your message. They can view a safety video on the big screen television in the kitchen. From here the crowd will go into the bedroom to learn about smoke detectors, how to call 911, they learn about checking doors for heat and exit drills in the home. The trailer is equipped with a smoke machine to introduce smoke into the room and set the smoke detector off and allow the participants exit out the bedroom window.

The trailer has an awning that can provide a shelter if it is raining or if the sun is shining.

The trailer is equipped with a 5,000 watt generator to power the electronic equipment as well as the air conditioner. It also has a heater system to allow the trailer to be operated in all seasons.
