OBJECTIVES

The Firefighter Survival & Rescue trailer is used in conjunction with the Kentucky Fire Commission's mandated curriculum "Firefighter Survival & Rescue". The main focus of the Firefighter Survival course is to present to the student several techniques to employ when he/she is about to get into trouble and needs to 'self-rescue'.

The Firefighter Rescue course employs techniques for the firefighters to use when attempting to rescue their fellow firefighter or others following a catastrophic event.

CAPABILITIES

This unit can travel to a location and be set up in a few minutes. Once set-up, the trailer will have 2 levels to train from, a stairwell to practice on, a wall with 16" wall studs to traverse, a window to escape from, and a confining space to execute the 'Denver-Drill'. Ladders are carried on the trailer to perform the second-story window escape.

Students are encouraged to use the old airpacks that are supplied on the trailer to eliminate the risk of damaging the departmental packs they routinely wear.

All elevated skills are performed with safety ropes to reduce the chances an unexpected fall.
